

Chapter 12. Copyright and Permission to Publish

To comply with the provisions of the U.S. Copyright Act of 1976 (P.L. 94-553), ASA, CSSA, and SSSA handle copyright and permissions in the following ways.

1. A Permission to Publish and Republish statement is used when the Societies do not intend to copyright an individual article in a publication. Authors of such articles retain authority and responsibility to decide on and respond to requests for further use by other persons or organizations.
2. A Transfer of Copyright form is used for publications where the individual articles are copyrighted by ASA, CSSA, and/or SSSA. Details of the transfer agreement are given on the form.

The permission to publish and republish statement is part of the online submissions process. The author checks the appropriate box depending on whether the author is a U.S. government employee, employee of non-U.S. governments that require separate copyright forms, or a nongovernment author. Generally, work done by government employees on government time is in the public domain and cannot be copyrighted; the form certifies how the work was done.

The copyright law also requires that permission be obtained to use copyrighted material that was published elsewhere. It is the author's responsibility to obtain permission from the owner of material not in the public domain. Correspondence should be sent to the appropriate copyright holder requesting permission. The permission statement(s) should be sent to headquarters to become part of the manuscript documentation.
